# **1. SPRING**

### A. ELECTIONS

The strength of an organization is a direct result of the strength of it's leaders. EVERYTHING RISES AND FALLS ON LEADERSHIP!



The selection of your KAY club leadership positions (officers and board members) is a very important part of your club's success.

It is important to start this process as soon as possible so your elected leaders can make time in their summer plans to attend KAY Leadership Camp (July 23-27).

You must select the right members as candidates. If you select well, the benefits are multiplied and seem nearly endless. If you select poorly, the problems are multiplied and seem endless.

### B. <u>DUES/ MEMERSHIP DRVE</u>

**KAY dues for the 2018-2019 school year will be \$2 per member.** What clubs choose to charge for membership is their choice however, please make sure that membership is affordable to all students.

Membership drives are an important part of every KAY school year. You should never "assume" that people are going to join your club out of tradition. It is important to successfully "sell your club" so others will want to join. Many people may not join because they don't know what KAY is all about.

### **IDEAS FOR THIS SPRING**

Visit with in-coming students' (5<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> graders) and make them aware of the KAY organization.



a. Schedule an assembly at their school to inform them of the KAY program. The use of a power point, skit, song, game show, etc. can be an entertaining and yet fun, informative way to get your point across.

b. Invite in-coming students to participate in a service project this spring, followed by refreshments and a question/answer period.



At the start of the 2018-2019 school year, sponsor an all-school assembly. Ask the president of each club/activity to speak 2-3 minutes about their club and it's objective, membership requirements, activities planned for the year, etc.

### C. TRANSITION OF LEADERSHIP

Organize a party, picnic, or gathering for out-going and in-coming officer and board members. Devote time to reviewing responsibilities and discussing ideas. Ask out-going officers & board members to share their experiences and insights from their year of service.



Leaders Create & inspire new leaders by instilling faith in their leadership ability and by helping them develop and have leadership skills they don't know they possess.

**Secure the President and sponsor's KAY Handbooks.** These publications are the property of the school. Retiring sponsors and graduating presidents are to clean out/ organize the handbook for their successor.

Begin discussion on your award goal for the 2018-2019 school year with the new board and officers. Be sure the goal you select is realistic and yet challenging.

### D. CELEBRATE YOUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE YEAR!




### "Celebration, Recognition, Appreciation".

There are all sorts of options for a special time together dinner (catered, pot luck, soup and salad, pizza, etc.) or you may choose to go with something little simpler, such as refreshments (cookies, cake, etc.) In conjunction, have a program before or after that may include the following:



1. Installation of Officers—There are various ways to provide a nice ceremony. Mar	ny
clubs have a candle lighting ceremony. Clubs are asked to send their program to the Sta	te
Director so they can be compiled and shared with clubs across the state.	



3. <u>Recognition of out-going Officers & Board Members</u>—Praise your board and officers for their year of leadership and service.

**4.** <u>Show Appreciation to your members</u>—Celebrate your accomplishments—review all of your club's activities. If you've taken pictures during the year, display them—or have them made into a power point presentation and give a "year in review" presentation.

5. <u>Celebrate Your Sponsor</u>—It is extremely important to show appreciation to your sponsor(s). Without their guidance, leadership and dedication—where would you be?

6. <u>Items to Show Appreciation</u>—Many clubs present KAY pins to their new officers/board members and/or the graduating members. The following items are available from the KAY State Office:

- C. Enroll Online Sponsors will register campers via the new online method.

  - E. Show the KLC Power point (that was shown at UC located on KAY website) to your KAY membership (all members are welcome to attend camp.)
- F. Organize a special fundraiser specifically for camp fees.
- G. Win a \$50 camp scholarship! All online camper registrations reaching the KSHSAA by May 1 will be eligible for a \$50 camp scholarship. See information with January, 2018 materials.
- H. Make \$\$! Sell Programs @ State Track Meet. See info with Jan. 2018 materials .
- I. **Camp Brochures and Posters** were handed out at UC in January/February, 2018. Additional Brochures are located online
- J. If eligible, apply for a **KLC Hardship or Back-to-Camp Scholarship**. Information provided with January, 2018 materials. Deadline is April 15.
