8. Student participation in interscholastic activity programs and competitions is a privilege.
9. Participation in interscholastic programs promotes student academic achievement.
10. Interscholastic activity programs promote positive school/community relations.
11. Safety, quality, and fairness in interscholastic activity programs are essential.
12. Fiscal responsibility by the KSHSAA benefits member schools.
13. Participation in interscholastic programs promotes good citizenship, improves life skills, and builds character.
14. Honesty, integrity and sportsmanship are the fundamentals upon which all interscholastic programs are built.
15. All professionals that are in contact with students should be knowledgeable and properly trained.

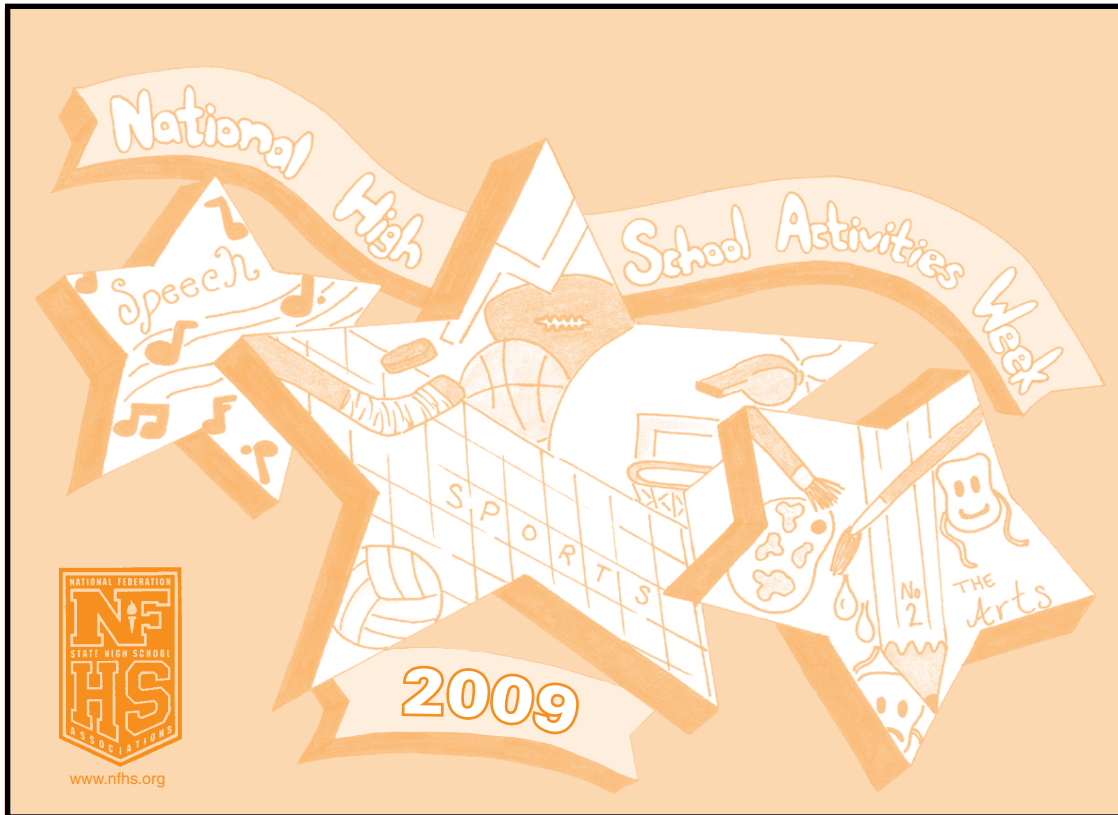
Possible Strategies for the KSHSAA:
