Please remember that school recommendations are only available to those officials who qualified to work postseason tournaments.

Match Contracts for the 2022 Season

No earlier than November 7, League Commissioners and/or school athletic directors will be extending contracts for matches and tournaments for the 2022 volleyball season. Officials are responsible for and encouraged to contact league commissions and/or athletic directors regarding your availability and interest in working matches.

NFHS Survey Available in Early November

Once again, the NFHS Volleyball survey will be available to all registered officials and the KSHSAA high school and middle school coaches. This survey provides everyone a voice in the NFHS Volleyball rules, feedback on the changes

Off-Season Preparation

Preparation in athletic officiating is never ending. Preparation cannot be limited to the period during which matches are played. The season is too short and the matches too few to achieve the necessary proficiency. The official's approach (attitude) to officiating will, in large measure, determine the degree and extent of preparation.

Officials' off-season preparation should include, but is not limited to, the following:

Maintain a physical conditioning program

Replacement/repair officiating gear (uniform, equipment)

Attend camps/clinics; stay abreast of the latest offensive/defensive systems

Review procedures, become acquainted with the academics of officiating

Take time for the philosophical reflection.

There are no shortcuts to becoming a competent official. Preparation is a result of unremitting thought, study, review, and labor.

Register for the 2022-2021 Season

In the spring of 2022, the KSHSAA will mail registration materials to all 2021 registered officials. These materials allow officials to register for the 2022-2023 school year. Officials who were registered during the 2021-2022 school year and who register for the following school year will have from June 1 until July 14 to register at the current rate of \$55 for one (1) sport and \$25 for each additional sport. Beginning July 15, experienced officials (those registered during the 2021-2022) will pay a \$75 fee for one sport and \$25 for each additional sport.

Update Address/Personal Info

Officials are reminded that if you have a change of address or change in your name, phone number, or email address, you are responsible to go to your personal page on the KSHSAA website and make the appropriate changes. In addition, all officials are strongly encouraged to post an appropriate personal photo on this site. Your picture is not available to the public. It is very helpful to school administrators and for fellow officials. Remember that the KSHSAA cannot contact you if you do not let us know of any contact changes.

Wanted: Officials for 2022-2023

This season we had 733 KSHSAA registered volleyball officials. While up from last year, we did not have the numbers from the 2019 season. While the registered numbers may seem rather large, if you consider how many volleyball matches take place across the state on any given night or weekend, there continues to be an ongoing need to recruit new officials to fill the needs of the member schools. During the off-season, all officials are encouraged to promote being an official among friends, former coaches, and players.
