- 10. Policy and Statute Alignment Based upon the inclusion of non-public school student eligibility in the state budget bill, multiple rule modifications are necessary. Staff will provide recommendations for the Executive Board which allow member schools to adhere to new regulations as detailed in House Sub for SB 113. These modifications alter some of the foundational elements of education-based activities by creating double standards for non-public school students compared to member school students. The language of the statute is provided in support material. Staff will provide a final copy of necessary rule modifications at the meeting. - See Support Material- (Discussion, Action)

Board of Director Meeting Breakout Debrief As part of the April 27 Board of Directors meeting, respective classifications of schools conducted breakout sessions to discuss critical topics which may require action or further study, including placement on the Regional Administrator Meeting agenda. - 13. Rule Review Rule 26 Anti-Tryout and Private Instruction Staff will lead a discussion relative to components of Rule 26 which are often discussed, particularly in conversations with those in the soccer community. A growing trend is for colleges to host "ID Camp" which are more evaluative in nature (little, if any instruction, takes place). The dual season (boys/fall, girls/spring) are not in sync with postsecondary programs which host these camps for prospective students. –See Support Material– (Discussion, Action)

Championship Tournament Seeding Staff will present final draft of what the Executive Board should consider as they contemplate next steps in creating larger pools for the initial rounds of postseason basketball and volleyball in classes 1A-DI, 1A-DII, 2A, and 3A. As part of the discussion, staff will also review the postseason officials assignment process for basketball and volleyball. See Support Material– (Discussion, Action)
- KSHSAA Policies, Membership Dues and Fees Annually, staff evaluate and recommend possible changes for policies, membership dues and fees. 21. Golf Manual Updates

Staff recommend the spectator guidelines for postseason golf be amended. Note, these are communicated through host managers and through school leadership (coach and administrator). Schools are encouraged to follow these guidelines for regular season competitions.

Staff recommend approval of the use of live scoring to be used in postseason play for golf. The protocol for scoring and reporting is detailed in the support material along with necessary manual changes. – *See Support Material*– (Discussion, Action)

- 22. **Baseball/Softball Seeding Amendments** Staff recommends approval of the proposed detail to be included in the Baseball/Softball Manual. This proposal changes the seeding date and first rounds of playdates for the 3-2-1A baseball postseason effective with the spring 2024 season. *See Support Material* (Discussion, Action)
- 23. Kansas Coaching School Staff will provide an update on Kansas Coaching School which is scheduled for July 31-August 1 in Topeka. *See Support Material*–(Information, Discussion)
- Loss of Instructional Time Survey Every four years, the KSHSAA conducts the Loss of Instructional Time Survey which is intended to reflect actual lost time for school students and teaching staff. The next survey is scheduled for the upcoming school year.
