The Executive Board met in the office of the Kansas State High School Activities Association on Thursday and Friday, March 16-17, 2023, with the following in attendance: President Roger Perkins, David Abel, Deena Horst, Mike Kastle, Ben Mitchell, Delvin Strecker, Tammie Romstad, Justin Seuser, Sean Spoons, Drew Thon, Paul Zuzelski and Bill Faflick, Executive Director. Board member Justin Briggs was absent both days.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items were all approved unanimously via consent:

- Minutes of the January 11-12, 2023 meeting.
- Items approved by KSHSAA staff on behalf of the Executive Board. **(A list of these items may be found at the end of these minutes.)**
- **Independent Schools Appointment** – Per **Bylaw Article IV, Section 4(e)**, the Executive Board appointed Superintendent Geoff Andrews, Catholic Diocese of Salina, to a one-year unexpired at-large term on the Board of Directors (2023-2024).
- **Middle/Jr. High At-Large Appointment** – Per **Bylaw Article IV, Section 5**, the Executive Board appointed Principal Connie Redic, Wichita-Curtis Middle School, to a two-year at-large term on the Board of Directors (2023-2025).

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

The Executive Board received reports from Executive Director Bill Faflick, and the Assistant Executive Directors regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. The staff reported on the culmination of winter activities and plans for the upcoming spring activity season. The Executive Director gave a financial report and update on legislative activities that may impact Kansas schools and the Association.

CLASSIFICATION FORUM

Staff shared the KIAAA Classification Forum topics which will be introduced and discussed at the KIAAA Conference in Mulvane, March 25-27, and noted the implications of several proposals. In lieu of providing verbal feedback to participants during the Classification Forum session at the KIAAA Conference, staff is preparing a written document identifying considerations for administrators as they participate. Those items supported at the KIAAA will be presented to the Executive Board at the April meeting.

POSTSEASON OFFICIATING FEES

Staff presented Executive Board members with historical background on game fees paid for officials working postseason contests. With COVID-19 hardships affecting previous reviews, Assistant Executive Director Fran Martin brought forth data on all KSHSAA sponsored activities. The Association has been on a three-year rotation when looking at fees paid and per this traditional schedule, in 2023, soccer, swimming & diving, track & field, and area supervisor officials pay rates were to be reviewed. The cycle will resume next year. After reviewing the information provided, the following game fees were approved effective with the 2023-24 school year:

WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP REVIEW

Staff led the Executive Board in a discussion regarding the success and challenges with each of the recently completed winter championship events. This opportunity allowed Executive Board members to provide suggestions for modification and future enhancements regarding postseason sites and procedures.

LIABILITY AND CATASTROPHIC INSURANCE

Jan Mason, Kent Miller, and Zach Barnes of Willis Towers Watson Insurance spoke with the Executive Board and provided an update on information pertaining to liability, catastrophic and medical coverage for member schools of the KSHSAA for the 2023-24 school year. It was voted unanimously to purchase coverage through Mutual of Omaha. Information regarding coverage and the premium per student will be mailed to all member school superintendents and principals in May with the annual membership mailing.

There are no changes in coverage from last year (\$25K deductible, \$5M lifetime benefit). More specific information regarding coverage and benefits for the 2023-24 school year will be provided in the membership mailing. The premium per student will increase by 22 cents/participant (2.9%) for the next school year. Member schools will pay **\$7.57 to cover each student (grades 7 – 12) participating in KSHSAA athletic activities**, regardless of the number of activities in which the student participates. The increase is based upon a catastrophic fee increase of \$.15, and an increase of \$.07 to the liability component.

MEMBER HIGH SCHOOL REQUESTS LEAGUE AFFILIATION HEARING

Superintendent John Whetzal and Athletic Director Scot Koranda from Riverside USD 114 appeared before the Executive Board to request the Association assign Wathena-Riverside High School to a league per **Bylaw ARTICLE XV, League Affiliation**, which reads as follows:

Section 1: Any member school not a member of a league or similar organization may apply to the KSHSAA Executive Board for assistance in acquiring league affiliation.

Section 2: The Board of Directors of the KSHSAA shall develop procedures whereby: (1) the requesting school shall submit sufficient evidence to the Executive Board that it has made a conscientious effort to become affiliated with an existing league; (2) if it appears that the Executive Board may take affirmative action on the request, the requesting school and any league to which the school may be assigned shall have an opportunity to be heard by the Executive Board prior to the time the assignment is made; (3) the Executive Board, after considering all the facts in the matter, may assign the school to an existing league; (4) in the event a school is assigned to a league under the above-mentioned circumstances, no members shall withdraw from that league for a period of three years without unanimous consent of all members of the league including the newly-assigned school, or approval of the Executive Board.

Riverside High School is currently a member of the Big 7 League but has been informed they will no longer be considered a member beginning in the 2024-25 school year. Information was presented to the Executive Board detailing unsuccessful efforts by the school to pursue league membership.

It was the decision of the Executive Board to grant a league assignment hearing at the June meeting of the Executive Board. Subsequently, that hearing has been scheduled for **Wednesday, June 14, 2023 at 3 p.m.** The Executive Board voted to have the members of the **Big 7 and Northeast Kansas Leagues** appear for the purposes of this hearing. It was noted, these leagues have similar sized schools in their membership and their member schools are in the approximate geographic area of Riverside schools. Superintendents and principals of all schools in the identified leagues will receive a communication from the KSHSAA inviting them to attend and participate in the June hearing.

LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE

On behalf of the KSCA, Mike Harris from Wichita-Southeast High School, presented the Board with information on Lincoln-Douglas debate and a proposal to create a separate stand-alone Lincoln-Douglas Debate Championship. Following discussion on background, potential timeframe for championships, and championship format, the Board asked for KSCA to encourage future L-D participation numbers as there are not enough schools to enact a new championship with multiple classifications at this time.

DUES APPROVED FOR 2023–2024

The Executive Board voted unanimously to continue member school dues at the current level of \$500 senior high and \$200 middle/junior high for the 2023-24 school year. KSHSAA membership materials will be mailed in May to building principals and superintendents of all member schools.

The Executive Board also voted unanimously to continue Approved School dues at the current level of \$200 for the year with an optional (additional) fee of \$50 for those participating in debate.

KSHSAA COACHING SCHOOL

Staff provided an update on the KSHSAA Coaching School scheduled for July 31-August 1, 2023. Keynote speakers for this year are Tiffany and Tyler Patmon. Tiffany is a former Andover Central HS student who played basketball at Oklahoma State University before heading to the WNBA. Her husband Tyler played football for OSU prior to his six-year career in the NFL. Together, they will speak on hard work and motivation to open the 77th annual KSHSAA Coaching School.

EARLY SEASON JAMBOREES FOR TEAM ACTIVITIES

Current rules indicate football is the only activity which allows for an early season jamboree. Per input from Fall Regional Administrator and Board of Education meetings and from the Executive Board, the opportunity to conduct jamborees is appropriate for all team activities. Those activities discussed were:

- Baseball
- Basketball
- Soccer
- Softball
- Volleyball

It is noted, the Board of Directors must approve Handbook rule amendments to allow for additional jamboree activities and the Executive Board must approve the parameters under which the jamborees may function. Following discussion, the Executive Board approved the following amendments to Handbook **Rules 30, 32, 33, 38, 39** and **43** to be placed on the April Board of Directors agenda:

Rule 30, Seasons of Activities, Section 1, Article 5:

Art. 5: Interschool scrimmages (practices) in all activities shall be prohibited (**Exceptions**, Rule 32 – Baseball, Rule 33 – Basketball, Rule 35 – Football, Rule 38- Soccer, Rule 39 – Softball, Rule 43 - Volleyball).

- a. Schools may not hold interschool scrimmages (practices) in athletics, (**Exceptions**, see Rule 32 – Baseball, Rule 33 – Basketball, Rule 35 – Football, Rule 38- Soccer, Rule 39 – Softball, Rule 43 - Volleyball) scholars bowl or debate. Interschool is defined as middle/junior school with another middle/junior school and senior high school with another senior high school. This does not eliminate scrimmages between alumni and the school team.

Rule 32 – Baseball (Boys)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

NEW - Art. 5: All practices and competitions shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage. No scrimmage shall be conducted except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

Rule 33 – Basketball (Boys and Girls)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

NEW - Art. 3: All practices and competitions shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage.. No scrimmage shall be conducted except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

(Subsequent articles renumbered)

Rule 38 – Soccer (Boys and Girls)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

NEW - Art. 3: All practices and competitions shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage. (For fall soccer, see Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities). Each individual player playing in the fall season shall participate in at least five days of practice (prior to, and not including the scrimmage) before their permitted scrimmage. No scrimmage shall be conducted except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

(Subsequent articles renumbered)

Rule 39 – Softball (Girls)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

NEW - Art. 4: All practices and competitions shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage. No scrimmage shall be conducted except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

(Subsequent articles renumbered)

Rule 43 – Volleyball (Girls)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

NEW - Art. 3: All practices and competitions shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage. (See Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities). No scrimmage shall be conducted except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

(Subsequent articles renumbered)

Pending potential approval by the Board of Directors, the Executive Board approved parameters for the jamborees in Baseball, Basketball, Soccer, Softball, and Volleyball. **These parameters are located at the end of these minutes.**

PROPOSED CHANGES TO PPE

Staff brought an updated proposal for a revision of language to Handbook **Rule 7, Physical Examination Parental Consent.** The Board voted unanimously to add the following item to the agenda for the April Board of Directors meeting.

Art. 1: No student is eligible to represent any school in interschool athletics, spirit or spirit competition groups until there is on file with the superintendent or principal, a statement certifying that the student has passed an adequate physical examination and is physically fit to participate in interschool athletics, spirit or spirit competition groups. The statement must be signed by any of the following licensed health care providers: (i) a physician; (ii) a chiropractor; (iii) a physician assistant (PA) who has been authorized to perform this examination by their state's law and licensing body ~~a Kansas licensed supervising physician~~; or (iv) an advance practice registered nurse (APRN) who has been authorized to perform this examination by their state's law and licensing body ~~a Kansas licensed supervising physician~~. This statement shall also be signed by a parent or legal guardian, stating the student has permission to participate.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO SEASONS OF ACTIVITIES RULE 30 RE TRYOUTS

In an effort to clarify individual student eligibility standards, staff presented an item for possible Board of Director agenda inclusion that would be congruent to both current practice and the spirit of the transfer policy. Specifically, if a student tries out for a team and does not make the competitive team roster, then subsequently transfer to a new school, the student would not be eligible at the new school in the same activity as their season for that activity had been completed when they were cut from the roster at the previous school. Following discussion, the Board voted to add the following item to the Board of Directors April agenda which would amend **Rule 30, Seasons of Activities:**

Art. 3: Following a change in schools, a student is not eligible at the new school if he/she tries out for a team at a former school, does not make the competitive team roster, and subsequently transfers to a new school seeking eligibility for the same activity in the same season.

(Subsequent Articles renumbered)

PROPOSED CHANGE TO SEASONS OF ACTIVITIES RE LATE START AND DUAL PARTICIPATION

At the January meeting, the Executive Board reviewed and approved amendments to **Rule 30 – Seasons of Activities, Rule 34 – Cross Country, Rule 35 – Football,** and **Rule 38 – Soccer** to be placed on the April Board of Directors agenda. These amendments are included to address heat acclimatization requirements for students whose initial competition is on or after Monday of SCW 13 and for those students who may be participating in two fall sports. Following final review by the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee, the following language was approved for the April Board of Directors Agenda:

Rule 30 - Seasons of Activities

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 8: Beginning Monday of SCW #7, the following practice rules apply to football, boys and girls cross country, fall season boys soccer, girls volleyball, girls gymnastics, fall season girls tennis and fall season girls golf:

Rule 34 - Cross Country (Girls & Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: Each athlete shall participate in twelve (12) days of practice with the team prior to participating in a meet taking place prior to Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year. Each athlete shall participate in a minimum of seven (7) days of practice with the team prior to participating in any meet taking place on or after Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year (See Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities). Credit shall be given for a day's practice whether or not it is on a school day.

Art. 2: Dual sport fall season student-athletes competing prior to Monday of SCW 13, may use up to three (3) football or soccer practices to count towards the cross country minimum practice requirement.

Rule 35 - Football (Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: Competition shall not begin prior to Wednesday of Standardized Calendar Week #9. (See Rule 30-1-8ae, Seasons of Activities).

- a. Credit shall be given for a day's practice whether or not it is on a school day.
- b. Each individual player shall participate in at least twelve (12) days of practice with the team prior to participating in a game taking place prior to Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year. Each athlete shall participate in a minimum of seven (7) days of practice with the team prior to participating in any game taking place on or after Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year before their first game.
- c. Dual sport fall season student-athletes competing prior to Monday of SCW 13, may use up to three (3) cross country or soccer practices to count towards the Football minimum practice requirement.

Rule 38 - Soccer (Girls & Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: From the first Tuesday following Labor Day through the last Friday preceding Memorial Day, no more than six players (excluding seniors) from the same school squad may practice or participate together on the same outside team. Participation by more than six squad members (excluding seniors) shall make them ineligible for the remainder of the school year and any further middle/junior or senior high soccer, unless reinstated by the Executive Board.

Art. 2: ~~No member school shall participate in a boys soccer contest until it has had (9) nine days of team practice, prior to and not including the first scheduled day of competition. (See Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities).~~ a. Each athlete shall participate in (9) nine days of practice with the team prior to participating in any fall a boys soccer contest taking place prior to Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year. Each athlete shall participate in a minimum of five (5) days of practice with the team prior to participating in any fall season soccer contest taking place on or after Monday of Standard Calendar Week 13 of the current school year. (See Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities).

- a. Dual sport fall season student-athletes competing prior to Monday of SCW 13, may use up to three (3) cross country or football practices to count towards the Fall Soccer minimum practice requirement.

BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR OFFICIALS

The Board continued discussion initiated at the January meeting relative to the current process utilized for background checks of registered officials. Staff led the Board through information related to using a more formal system of background checks, detailing a preferred system, and anticipated cost. Following discussion, the Board decided not to take any action and asked staff to monitor changes to state laws that may affect the future of KSHSAA background check policy.

APPROVED EVENTS PROTOCOL CHANGE

KSHSAA Handbook **Bylaw XIV – Approval of Events** indicates the following in **Section 3:**

Any contest or activity under the jurisdiction of the KSHSAA sponsored by an outside agency which is on the approved list of the National Association of Secondary School Principals shall be considered automatically approved.

The NASSP is discontinuing the service of approving events beginning in 2023-24. Staff discussed a interim solution of approving events historically/previously approved by the NASSP to be approved for this next school year until a new protocol is established to review events sponsored by outside agencies. Following discussion, the Executive Board approved the following item for inclusion on the Board of Directors April meeting agenda:

The NASSP is discontinuing the service of approving events. At this time, no other agency or process has been identified to provide this service. The Executive Board recommends the Board of Directors temporarily suspend Bylaw XIV, Section 3, and utilize the roster of all events historically approved by the NASSP and attended by KSHSAA member schools to be approved for the next school year. Staff will identify and recommend a new protocol prior to the April 2024 Board of Directors meeting.

CLASSIFICATION OF SPIRIT SHOWCASE

The Board was presented with a change for classification to apply for the KSHSAA spirit showcase competitions. The change would use the same format for cheer and dance showcases as what is currently used for football. Following discussion, the Board unanimously approved the following proposal to be added to the April Board of Directors agenda:

Modify Rule 5, Classification of Senior High Schools, Section 2, Article 1 by adding the following exception at the end:

Spirit Competition Groups Exception: Classifications for the purpose of creating Spirit Competition Group assignments shall be based on the total enrollment as submitted to the KSHSAA on the date established by state statute for official enrollment from the previous school year.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING – AGENDA REVIEW

Following a preview of the KSHSAA Board of Directors April 27 meeting, the Executive Board approved a draft of the finalized agenda for the meeting. This included discussing items added to the agenda from other entities as well as finalizing agenda items that had been discussed at previous meetings.

The Board of Directors meeting will be held at the KSHSAA office building in Topeka and will begin at 3:00 p.m. on April 27, 2023.

NEW KSHSAA STAFF POLICY

Office Manager Brent Unruh presented a proposal to the Board creating a “Work from Home” Policy to be implemented for KSHSAA office staff. Following discussion, the Board unanimously approved the following policy to be added to the KSHSAA staff handbook:

All full-time employees with job responsibilities that can be completed away from the physical office may choose to work from home under the following parameters:

1. *Employees may choose to work from home up to eight (8) hours per week.*
2. *Employees shall request approval from their immediate supervisor and Director of Operations no later than Friday preceding the week in which they are requesting work from home time. Once approved, staff shall indicate work from home status on the staff calendar.*
3. *Work from home shifts shall be in minimum 2-hour increments.*

4. *At least 75% of work from home hours in a week shall take place during normal office hours.*
5. *Employees working from home shall be available via phone and email during normal office hours. Adequate phone and internet service while working from home is the responsibility of the employee.*
6. *Employees working from home shall attend any scheduled staff meetings remotely.*
7. *A maximum of two (2) staff members in administrative assistant roles may work from home at the same time.*
8. *Requests to work from home in excess of eight (8) hours per week due to special circumstances shall be submitted to the Executive Director or Director of Operations.*
9. *Employees are responsible to ensure any in-office responsibilities are covered while they are working from home.*
10. *Non-exempt employees: Unless approved by the Executive Director or Director of Operations, employees shall not work in excess of 8 hours per day (onsite and WFH time combined), and work from home time may not be used to earn flex time or overtime.*

Work from home blackout periods:

August – May: Mondays

Summer: SCW 5

Fall: SCW 16 & 17

Winter: SCW 34, 35, 36

Spring: SCW 45, 46, 47

Other days designated by the Executive Director, Director of Operations, and/or Assistant Executive Director(s) where onsite staffing is necessary to carry out Association operations.

KSCA PROPOSAL FOR ADDITIONAL DEBATE MEDALS

The KSHSAA received a request to provide additional medals for the State 4-Speaker and 2-Speaker Debate Championship tournaments. Specifically, the KSCA would like to honor the following:

Regional 4-Speaker Debate- all state qualifiers receive a State Qualifier generic medal.

- Additional 84 medals

State 2-Speaker Debate- double octafinal round all receive medals in 6A Only.

- Additional 64 medals

Assistant Executive Director Craig Manteuffel discussed making changes at this point instead of during the KSCA proposal period at the April and June meetings due to the timing for printing 2023-24 manuals. Following discussion, the Board took no action on the request.

KSHSAA BASEBALL JAMBOREE

A jamboree is an opportunity for member high schools to participate in a controlled playing environment providing a meaningful learning and training experience for players, coaches, officials and spectators per the following conditions:

- Only KSHSAA member high schools may participate in a jamboree.
- Participation in a jamboree is optional for member school teams (not required).
- Each student athlete is limited to one jamboree date. It does not constitute a regular season contest.
- The jamboree must be conducted prior to the first regular season competition.
- It is recommended member schools develop contracts between participating schools to confirm details of location, date, time, format, etc.
- Supervision of the jamboree event is the responsibility of participating school administration.
- Participating schools determine admission policies and procedures.
- NFHS playing rules apply, with the following exceptions:
 - Time may be modified within constraints detailed below.
 - Time-outs may be modified/extended in order to provide additional coaching/learning for participants.
 - Coaches may enter the competition area for teaching/learning opportunities.
- Teams may wear school uniforms.
- The jamboree must be officiated by KSHSAA registered officials.
- It is strongly encouraged to use jamborees as training opportunities for officials.

Baseball Jamboree - Additional details

1. A jamboree consists of three (3) or four (4) member school teams.
2. **NO SCHOOL MAY PLAY MORE THAN 12 INNINGS OF BASEBALL ON A PRESEASON JAMBOREE DATE.** For example, if the jamboree consists of four (4) teams, then each team can play four innings against each of the other three (3) teams. **NO INDIVIDUAL PLAYER SHOULD BE INVOLVED IN PLAYING IN MORE THAN 12 INNINGS.** If a player courtesy runs, that is an inning.
Options:
If Jamboree consists of 3 teams: Teams will play two 6 innings scrimmages for a total of 12 innings.
If Jamboree consists of 4 teams: Teams will play three 4 inning scrimmages for a total of 12 innings.
3. Each pitcher is limited to 45 or fewer total pitches.

INTERPRETATION: The 12-inning limit is established for each team. For example: In a 3-team rotation, varsity school teams may participate on one field and sub-varsity team on an adjacent/other field, with both teams playing 12 innings for the event, provided that no individual player participates in more than 12 innings.

KSHSAA BASKETBALL JAMBOREE

A jamboree is an opportunity for member high schools to participate in a controlled playing environment providing a meaningful learning and training experience for players, coaches, officials and spectators per the following conditions:

- Only KSHSAA member high schools may participate in a jamboree.
- Participation in a jamboree is optional for member school teams (not required).
- Each student athlete is limited to one jamboree date.
- The jamboree must be conducted prior to the first regular season competition.
- It is recommended member schools develop contracts between participating schools to confirm details of location, date, time, format, etc.
- Supervision of the jamboree event is the responsibility of participating school administration.
- Participating schools determine admission policies and procedures.
- NFHS playing rules apply, with the following exceptions:
 - Time may be modified within constraints detailed below.
 - Time-outs may be modified/extended in order to provide additional coaching/learning for participants.

Basketball Jamboree - Additional details

1. A jamboree consists of three (3) or four (4) member school teams.
2. Each school may only play a maximum of six four-minute periods using regular NFHS timing plus game situations as described in following:

At the end of the final 4:00 period of the day for each team, one 5:00 running clock period between the two teams that just completed their final 4:00 period will be timed for coaches to work on situations at their discretion. At the end of this 5:00 running clock period, the jamboree concludes for those teams. In a three-team format, one team will participate in two 5:00 running clock periods (team C in the example above). There is to be 1:00 between periods with the same two teams competing, similar to the end of a quarter in a real game. When two teams complete their time against each other and other team(s) are brought on the court, the transition should be completed as quickly as possible, but will not be timed. Each team receives one :30 time out per opponent and does not carry over to the following opponent.

Soccer Jamboree - Additional details

1. A jamboree consists of three (3) or four (4) member school teams.
2. Each individual player must participate in at least five (5) days of practice before that individual is permitted to participate in a fall jamboree. The practice requirement does not apply to spring jamborees.
3. Each school may only play a maximum of 60 minutes as described below:

3-Team Format

A vs. B = 30 minutes

B vs. C = 30 minutes

A vs. C = 30 minutes

(Each school will play a maximum of two 30-minute periods.)

4-Team Format

A vs. B = 20 minutes

C vs. D = 20 minutes

A vs. C = 20 minutes

B vs. D = 20 minutes

A vs. D = 20 minutes

B vs. C = 20 minutes

(Each school will play a maximum of three 20-minute periods.)

INTERPRETATION: The 60 minute limit is established for each team. For example: varsity school teams may participate on one field and sub-varsity teams on the other with both teams getting 60 minutes of play for the event provided that no player gets more than 60 minutes as stated in the guidelines.

4. During playing periods, coaches and/or officials may request to work on specific situations such as Corner Kick, Goal Kick, Throw-In, Free Kick, Penalty Kick, Offside, and DOGSO.

 - a. If Jamboree consists of 3 teams:
Teams will play two – 6 innings scrimmages for a total of 12 innings
 - b. If Jamboree consists of 4 teams:
Teams will play three – 4 inning scrimmages for a total of 12 innings

INTERPRETATION: The 12-inning limit is established for each team. For example: In a 3-team rotation, varsity school teams may participate on one field and sub-varsity team on the other, with both teams getting 12 innings for the event, provided that no player gets more than 12 innings, as stated in the guidelines.

- Only KSHSAA member high schools may participate in a jamboree.
- Participation in a jamboree is optional for member school teams (not required).

- The jamboree must be conducted prior to the first regular season competition.
- It is recommended member schools develop contracts between participating schools to confirm details of location, date, time, format, etc.
- Supervision of the jamboree event is the responsibility of participating school administration.
- Participating schools determine admission policies and procedures.
- NFHS playing rules apply, with the following exceptions:

Volleyball Jamboree - Additional details

1. The jamboree shall consist of play between three (3) or four (4) member schools (no duals).
2. Additional NFHS Rule modification: automatic side out following five consecutive serves by one player.
3. The jamboree can be a three or four school format only. When there are three schools participating, a maximum of six sets (three against each team to 21 points) shall be allowed. When there are four schools participating, a maximum of nine sets (three against each team to 15 points) shall be allowed. Point caps are at the host's discretion.
